Auditions will be held at the Art & Music Center, located on the campus of Aquinas College.

Please prepare 16-20 bars of a song (approx a minute of music). Please bring sheet music, an accompanist will be provided. Be prepared to dance.

THE STORY: Four eccentric Broadway stars are in desperate need of a new stage. So when they hear that trouble is brewing around a small-town prom, they know that it's time to put a spotlight on the issue...and themselves. The

town's parents want to keep the high school dance on the straight and narrow—but when one student just wants to bring her girlfriend to prom, the entire town has a date with destiny. On a mission to transform lives, Broadway's brassiest join forces with a courageous girl and the town's citizens and the result is love that brings them all together. Winner of the Drama Desk Award for Best Musical, THE PROM expertly captures all the humor and heart of a classic musical comedy with a message that resonates with audiences now more than ever.

CASTING: All actors age 17-70; all ethnicities; abled and disabled are encouraged to audition.

NOTE: In reference to the character descriptions below — The characters in this show are on the binary and written with he/him or she/her pronouns as you will see in the following descriptions. However, we seek to be as inclusive as possible and ask gender non-conforming, gender queer, transgender and non-binary actors to list on the audition form the roles they most identify with. Roles will be open for consideration of actors of all ethnicities.

INTIMACY NOTE: There will be intimacy and intimate scenes in this production including: kissing, same sex kissing and casual touching.

CHARACTERS:

EMMA NOLAN: Teenager in Indiana. A reluctant poster child for LGBT youth. Very smart. A bit of a tomboy quality. Mezzo-Soprano/Alto Vocal Range. Age 17.

ALYSSA GREENE: A cheerleader and top student. Secretly Emma's girlfriend. Faces constant pressure from her mother and friends. Alto/Mezzo-Soprano Vocal Range. Age 17.

MR. HAWKINS: The straitlaced school principal. An ally to Emma and a long-time fan of Dee Dee. Baritone/Bass Vocal Range. Age 40-60.

MRS. GREENE: Alyssa's intimidating, conservative, but ultimately loving mother. The head of the PTA. Alto Vocal Range. Age 40-50.

SHELBY, KAYLEE, NICK, KEVIN: Other students at school who bully (but eventually learn to accept) Emma. All Vocal Ranges. Age 17.

BARRY GLICKMAN: Flamboyant Broadway star. Completely politically incorrect and doesn't know it. Longs to give Emma the prom he was unable to have as a teen. Baritone/Tenor Vocal Range. Age 40-50.

DEE DEE ALLEN: Broadway diva. A huge ego to match her huge talent. Hilariously self-involved but yearns to do something good for someone other than herself. Alto Vocal Range. Age 40-65.

TRENT OLIVER: Pretentious Juilliard graduate recently cast in the non-Equity tour of *Godspell*. Loves to hear himself speak. Baritone/Tenor Vocal Range. Age 40-50.

ANGIE DICKINSON: An ensemble member in the Broadway production of *Chicago*. Jaded Fosse girl with a heart of gold. Alto Vocal Range. Age 40-50.

SHELDON: A charismatic press agent. Baritone Vocal Range. Age 40-60.

ENSEMBLE: Olivia Keating, Opening Night Party Attendees, Reporters, High School Students, PTA Members, Motel Clerk, Cast of the Non-Equity Tour of *Godspell*, Monster Truck Rally Audience, Mrs. Greene's Friend, LGBT Students. All Vocal Ranges. Ages 17-70.
